During his keynote, Mullane establishes that the best teams practice certain fundamentals: maintaining high standards of performance; building trust among the team; and giving individuals the responsibility of “finding their voice”

James P. Lewis, Ph.D. and Certified Integral Coach (CIC), is an experienced project manager, who teaches seminars on the subject throughout the world. His solid, nononsense approach is largely the result of the 15 years he spent working as a Project Manager, Product Engineering Manager/Chief Engineer for Aerotron, Inc. and ITT Telecommunications, both of Raleigh NC. Lewis has trained over 35,000 project managers and is the author of 12 books on project management. He has a B.S. in electrical engineering and a Ph.D. in psychology, both from NC State University in Raleigh NC.

25th Anniversary Keynote Speaker: Bill Moylan

Bill A Moylan, PhD, PMP, FESD, is a tenured professor of construction management at Eastern Michigan University and also serves on the Global PMI Board of Directors. Bill's presentation discusses how project management emphasizes results, communication, and learning, which add up to real business value, organizational value, and strategic value. Through case studies and findings from the global *Researching the Value of Project Management* study, this presentation shows where and how project management makes a difference. Bill will also include career-oriented material and a PMI update with news on current initiatives.

PM Technical Skills & Tools Track

1 Project Management Hiring Panel: Who are the A Players This hiring panel will explore the skills, talents, and experiences of the best project managers. Who are the most successful project managers and why? What will project managers of the future look like and how can you prepare to be one of the best?

2 Leading to Recovery: Being a Leader in Times of Significant Change Today's economic crisis has been described as “The Big Reset.” Everyone, corporations and individuals alike, will be facing a very different world when we emerge from the global recession. This presentation covers elements that will be essential to put us on the path to recovery and sustainable economic growth.

3 Speaking to Non-Technical People You know what you're talking about so why doesn't your staff or your clients always do what you need them to do? It could be because they don't understand the way you communicate. In this session the following will be outlined: useful methods of making key points clearly and concisely; translating technical jargon into everyday speech; and listening to your listener.

PM Soft Skills Track

1 Intelligent Decision Making Intelligent decision making is even more important in these challenging economic times. Learn what it takes to make intelligent decisions to enable success today and into the future. You can take this information and use it immediately in your personal and professional project management life. Come prepared to learn how you can improve in this critical area.

2 I Don't Have Time to Manage Requirements Although many project managers recognize the importance of getting customer requirements right, finding the time to collect requirements is challenging. This interactive presentation clears up the confusion between managing the project and managing the requirements, and provides a consultative approach for managing the requirements.

3 Influencing Others: How to Get the Results You Want In most companies, select few people have the authority to make important business decisions unilaterally. Reaching group consensus can be challenging, but is often critical, and influencing others is one of the most important determinants of success. This session describes nine methods of influence and their effectiveness that will help you understand the importance of successfully influencing others.

4 Leadership: The Final Frontier Good project managers control a project's schedule, scope and budget; but great project managers provide great leadership. This presentation provides techniques and strategies for nurturing and improving your leadership capabilities; incorporating examples and lessons-learned from the trenches and wisdom gleaned from recognized leaders from a variety of industries.

It will review how to select organizational and project measures using the proven Goal/Question/ Metric approach.

This session will define EA in detail, will describe methodologies used for EA, and artifacts produced. Students will discover how EA fosters a stronger relationship between IT and business. EA has the potential to transform the way organizations deliver services and products!

3 Successful Project Planning: Will Your Project Plan Get the Job Done? As a Project Manager, what can you do to ensure your projects go well? In today's business environment, project budgets are tight, resources are stretched, and leadership wants it done yesterday. This session focuses on the critical factors that will increase the odds of having a successful project plan and explore the three key variables to be considered in building a successful project plan.
